Organizational Studies is a multidisciplinary minor that analyzes the subject matter of organizations from different scholarly vantage points. The minor draws from Anthropology and Sociology, Economics, and Psychology courses, as well as classes offered by other academic departments and programs.

Students who pursue this minor will increase their capacity to engage effectively with organizations as citizens, employees, and stakeholders. They will study organizational theories, learn about the effects that organizations have on society, and consider multidisciplinary approaches to research on organizations.
